



## **ADDITIONAL DIRECTIVE (VI) ON MINIMUM OF THREE-QUARTERS (3/4) VEHICLE TANK VOLUME UPON ENTRY INTO BRUNEI DARUSSALAM**

As part of efforts by the Government of His Majesty the Sultan dan Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam to ensure that sales of petroleum products are continually controlled, the Department of Energy at the Prime Minister's Office hereby announces the following additional measures:

- (i) All foreign registered vehicles shall continue to only purchase non-subsidised fuels at market price (as per 3<sup>rd</sup> Additional Directive on Sales of Diesel and Motor Gasoline Premium 97 to Vehicles and Vessels not registered in Brunei Darussalam, issued on 19 June 2008).
- (ii) As of 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2026:
  - (a) All foreign registered vehicles entering Brunei Darussalam must have minimum fuel level of three-quarters ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) upon entry. Foreign-registered vehicles that do not comply with this requirement will not be allowed to enter Brunei Darussalam. Official vehicles of Governments are exempted from this requirement.
  - (b) For Brunei Darussalam-registered vehicles returning from abroad, the three-quarters ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) tank fuel level requirement will not apply on the first entry. However, the requirement will be enforced for the second and subsequent entries within a 24-hour period.
  - (c) This Additional Directive will be enforced at all border points in Brunei Darussalam by the Royal Customs and Excise Department, Ministry of Finance and Economy, and at all fuel retail stations jointly by the Department of Energy at the Prime Minister's Office, Petroleum Authority of Brunei Darussalam and Brunei Shell Marketing Sdn. Bhd.



(d) Members of the public and all vehicle owners are advised to comply with all Fuel Directives, currently in effect and to extend their full cooperation to the relevant authorities.
